## Academic Schedules:

**Mrs. Hess's courses: All English Students:** Due to standardized testing, students met for these classes twice this week; therefore, many of the goals listed are similar to those of last week. Also, the after-school tutoring/extended study time continues to be provided (Monday-Friday from 3:30-4:30). For next week, all students will take their next spelling/vocabulary test Friday, April 29<sup>th</sup>. I encourage students to review their words and definitions daily. (Students already have their lists in case you feel any extra study time is needed.) **Sr. High English:** Students will continue literature Unit 5: Folklore and Epic. Mythology is our focus, and a research paper has been assigned. In grammar, we will take a Unit 14: Usage and Diction quiz. A comprehensive exam (Units 1-14) is also scheduled. Quizzes in both literature and grammar will be administered regularly, and completion of homework is essential. **Jr. High English:** In grammar, students are now studying Sentence Structure as we continue Chapter 8: Phrases and Clauses. The memorization of the coordinating, correlative, and subordinating conjunction charts have been assigned, and students will take a quiz over the charts next week. Please encourage recite to recite the charts to you as time allows. Types of phrase and clauses continue to be our focus. **Speech/Oral Communications:** The drama club continues to prepare for our *Sherlock Holmes in Never Never Land* production. Students should have lines learned by Monday as we will focus on stage directions in earnest. Memorization of the lines help so much. Please continue to discuss costuming with them, too, and contact me if you have any questions. I appreciate our communication thus far. Other coursework goals include poetry interpretation for a test grade and storytelling presentations for a quiz grade. The stories should not be memorized; students should only follow an outline. (As always, students should continue to keep their notebooks organized and up to date as expected which are a part of the class expectations as well.)

**Mr. Huddleston's course: World History** students will begin the week by leaving the 19th Century with the world moving toward war. Students will be taking a test over Chapters 19 – 21 on Monday and a quiz over pages 323-325 on Wednesday.

**Mrs. Headley's course: Jr. High History** students will begin Chapter 19: Progressivism. We will study changes in American life and the development of different religious attitudes in our country. Students will also compare and contrast Roosevelt's, Taft's, and Wilson's progressivism plans. There will be a quiz over section I on Tuesday. Students will begin their final current event project this week, as we take on the perspective of a person living during the years of the "Roaring Twenties" and "Great Depression."

**Mrs. Middlebrooke's courses: Jr. High Science** students will continue to study astronomy. They will have quizzes over Sections 11.2-11.3. **Biology** students will study fish. They will have a quiz over Sections 19.2-19.3 and a test over Chapter 19. They will dissect a perch. **Physics** students will study the reflection of light. They will have a test over Chapter 19. **Basic Math** students will continue to work circles and angles. They will have daily speed drills and a quiz over class material. **Jr. High Reading** students will continue to read selections from *Excursions in Literature*. They should expect regular quizzes over class material.

**Mr. Smith's courses: Pre-Algebra** students will learn the Pythagorean Theorem and the Trigonometric functions of Sine, Cosine, and Tangent. There will be a quiz over materials taught. **Algebra I** students will solve quadratic equations by graphing, solve absolute-value inequalities, and solve quadratic equations using square roots. There will be a quiz over materials taught and test through lesson 95. **Geometry** students will calculate the area of a trapezoid, find the ratios of areas of two triangles, and solve areas of two similar triangles. There will be a quiz over sections 5.1-5.5. **Precalculus** students will learn the inverse Sine and Cosine functions. There will be a quiz over section 7.1. **Junior High Bible** students will learn about the books of I and II Corinthians. **High School Bible** students will discuss biblical aspects of being in a romantic relationship. There will be a quiz over materials taught. **All Bible students will have a verse memorization test on Friday – Luke 24:36-45. We will work to memorize them in class. There should be little studying outside of class if students participate well during memorization time.**
